incredibly powerful," Goldberg said.

His writings centered on three themes: telling his parents he was HIV-positive, the first time he was hospitalized and his experiences in an HIV support group and with his therapist.

Greenberg wrote a play, "Late Sun." It received a professional reading in Los Angeles, Goldberg said. It was autobiographical and dealt with his coming to grips with being HIV-positive and finding love, both within one's self and with someone else, he said.

While his experiences and the law were clearly important to him, Greenberg held his family dear, especially his nephew, Samuel, and his relationships with his friends, Goldberg said. His last two years in New York City were important to him.

"It was something he always wanted ... and was very empowering," Goldberg said.

While there, Greenberg was active with the PWA Health Group and Gay Men's Health Center.

Greenberg grew up in Philadelphia's East Oak Lane section. He was a 1970 graduate of Central High School, a 1974 graduate of the University of Pennsylvania and a 1977 graduate of Temple Law School.

He is survived by his parents, retired Common Pleas Judge Stanley M. and Claire Richter Greenberg of Philadelphia; a brother and sisterin-law, Bernard and Allison of Bensalem; two nephews, Samuel and Zachary; and two

cousins, Linda Levin and Ellen Goldberg.

A memorial service will be at 2 p.m. July 14 at the top of the Bell Atlantic Tower Building, 1717 Arch St. A scene from his play will be part of the service.

Funeral services were on June 16. Burial was at Roosevelt Memorial Park in Trevose.
