Obituary

David Bertugli

David Bertugli, a well-known Center City writer, died April 5, 1997, from AIDS-related complications. He was 48.

"David was a wonderful person," said friend Ronda Goldfein, staff attorney for the AIDS Law Project of Pennsylvania. "He was truly concerned with making things better for people with HIV. He was always willing to talk to people, to be supportive of people with HIV, both emotionally and financially, if necessary. I'm so sad."

Bertugli earned a master's degree from the State University of New York at Binghamton.

Bertugli was a volunteer with the AIDS Law Project of Pennsylvania, MANNA, and Calcutta House.

He was a founder of We The People With AIDS/HIV, and a former board member of ActionAIDS.

He is survived by his life partner, Gary K. Bailey; his parents, Emil and Emma Bertugli of Carmichaels; and a brother, Ronald of Carmichaels.

A memorial service will be held at 2 p.m. April 13 at St. Luke and The Epiphany Church, 313 S. 13th St.
