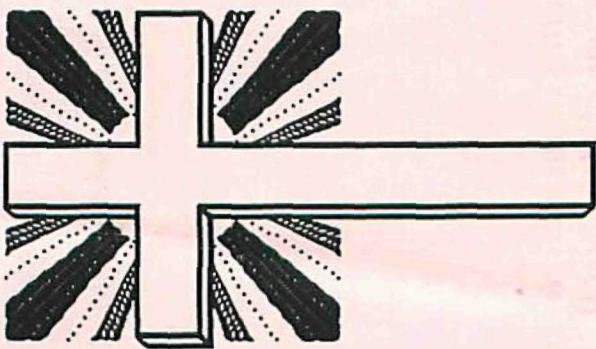
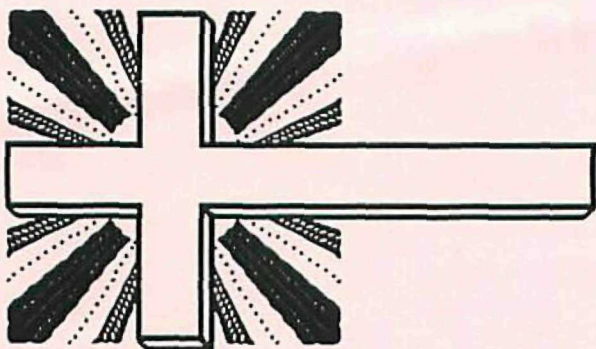
Responsorial:
