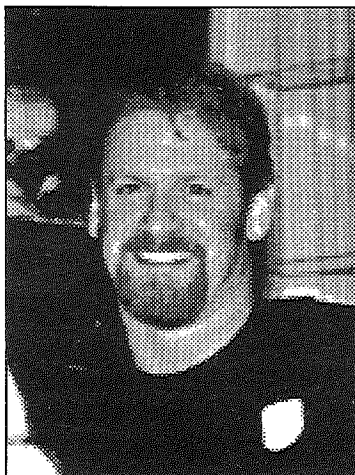
# OBITUARIES

## Shawn Oliver Dillon

Shawn Oliver Dillon, 35, of Beverly, N.J., died Aug. 16 at home of AIDS-related complications.

Dillon was born in Camden, N.J. He served in the U.S. Marine Corps. He was a resident of Willingboro, N.J., for most of his life before moving to Beverly. He was manager of I.T. Travel of Princeton, N.J., and a partner in Jack-D's Telephone Answering Service in Beverly. Earlier, Dillon had worked as an advertising sales representative for Philadelphia Gay News.

Dillon sang with the Spruce Street Singers in Philadelphia, and was the managing partner of "Real Dummies — Live Mannequins" in Princeton. He



was a member of the Burlington County Gay and Lesbian Alliance. Dillon was a movie enthusiast and avid cook.

Surviving are his longtime

companion, Jack Gwin, with whom he lived; his mother, Barbara Aspers of Willingboro; his father, Oliver Dillon of Beverly; two brothers, Robert Mallot of Mount Holly, N.J., and Christopher Mallot of Brockton, Mass.; two sisters, Cathleen Kelso and Jennifer Pflaumer, both of Beverly; and an aunt and several nieces and nephews.

A memorial service for Dillon will be held at 2 p.m. Sept. 15 at the Moorestown Friends Meeting House, 18 Main St., Moorestown, N.J.
